

## Making an appeal



If you don't want to stay in hospital, you can ask for help. This is called an appeal.



You can appeal to the Mental Health Review Tribunal or the Hospital Managers.

You or a relative can write a letter to the Mental Health Review Tribunal or the Hospital Managers.



You can ask them to review your care.



You will find the addresses at the end of this leaflet.




The Mental Health Review Tribunal or the Hospital Managers will ask your doctor, your care-co-ordinator and nurse for a report.



If you need help to write a letter look at the leaflet called **Help**.



If you appeal to the Mental Health Review Tribunal you will be given a solicitor to help you.



A solicitor knows about the law.



You will not have to pay to get help from a solicitor.




You must write to the Mental Health Review Tribunal during your first 14 days in hospital.

You can write to the Hospital Managers at any time.




People from the Mental Health Review Tribunal or the Hospital Managers will come to talk to you.






If you apply to the Mental Health Review Tribunal a different doctor will come to see you.



All the people from Mental Health Review Tribunal will meet to decide if you can leave hospital.



The Mental Health Review Tribunal will meet within 7 working days of receiving your letter.

The Hospital Managers can meet at anytime.
